Dear Shaarie Torah Community,

A few weeks ago, we read Parashat Sh'lach—a portion filled with big, dramatic moments: the scouts exploring the land, their fearful report, and the mitzvah of tzitzit. These are the headline stories. Recently, Rabbi Menachem Creditor highlighted a quiet detail in that parashah which I've been carrying with me. He pointed out that this detail isn't loud or flashy. In fact, it's the smallest thing in the whole Torah: the Hebrew letter yud.

We read (Numbers 13:16):

וויקָרָא מֹשֶׁה לְהוֹשֵׁעַ בִּן־נָוּן יְהוֹשֶׁעַ - "And Moshe called Hoshea bin Nun, Yehoshua."

What's the difference between Hoshea and Yehoshua? Just one letter. A little yud. But that tiny addition changes everything. That's the moment Joshua becomes the one who will eventually lead our people into the Promised Land.

There's a midrash that says the yud came from Sarai's name when she became Sarah—and that it didn't just disappear. It waited. For generations. Until it could help transform someone's future.

That's what sticks with me. That small things matter. That even the tiniest piece of something sacred can make a big difference. That sometimes, just showing up—just being there—can shape history.

We are that yud.

We're not a big people. Israel is not a big country. And yet, we're carrying so much right now—grief, fear, anger, confusion, and hope. Missiles are falling. Lives have been lost. There's so much heartbreak and anxiety and exhaustion. The weight can feel overwhelming.

But small doesn't mean powerless. The yud reminds us that we still get to matter. We still get to make a difference.

So I want to say this clearly: If you're feeling overwhelmed, you don't have to carry it alone.

You're part of a community. Congregation Shaarie Torah is here for you.

Please reach out—to me, to our team, to each other. Whether you're angry, sad, scared, or just need someone to talk to—we're here. That's what community is for.

And if you're looking for something to do—something that might feel small, but isn't—send a note to someone you love. Call someone carrying too much. Take a walk. Come to shul. Learn some Torah. Pray. Rest. These little things add up. Just like a yud.

Even when we're tired, we can still show up. Even when we feel small, we can still choose courage. Even in heartbreak, we can still create connection.

Not matter what, we can lift our voices together in the enduring hope that peace is possible:

"Oseh Shalom bimromav, Hu ya'aseh shalom aleinu v'al kol Yisrael, v'al kol yoshvei tevel—May the One who makes peace in the high heavens make peace for us, for all Israel, and for all who dwell on Earth."

God of our ancestors, shield the people of Israel in this time of danger. Watch over the soldiers who defend her and the civilians who seek shelter. Bring comfort to those who mourn and healing to the injured. Grant wisdom to leaders, compassion to all hearts, and strength to those who strive for justice and mercy.

May we, even from afar, be sources of light. May our words bring hope, and our actions reflect our deepest values. And may we never lose faith in a future of peace.

May we remember that our presence matters. That being small doesn't mean being insignificant. And may we keep lifting each other up, one act of love at a time.
