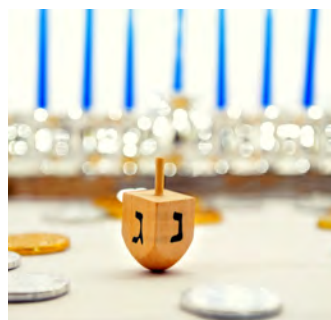

➔ FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

JEW'S MUST SPEAK UP BECAUSE SILENCE IS ASSENT



In times of moral danger silence is assent. This is such a time. Therefore I am taking the unusual step of using this space to address what is happening in our country.

It began with the assault on truth. The President's breathtaking dishonesty is well documented.

Russian-born journalist Masha Gessen, wrote "Lying is the message. It's not just that both Putin and Trump lie, it is that they lie in the same way and for the same purpose: blatantly, to assert power over truth itself."

The lies and incompetence led to the assault on democracy. This is how he speaks of his critics: The media: "enemy of the people." Federal courts: "incompetent," "horrible," "ridiculous," and a "complete and total disgrace." Congressional critics have committed "treason" or are "third rate." The duly appointed (Republican) Special Counsel: "a disgrace to our nation." Political leaders of his own party: "human scum."

Anything or anyone that might challenge his will - the truth, the media, the Congress, political opponents (and allies!), the courts, - is castigated as illegitimate. None of this is new. But recent events brought us to a crossroads.

"Sure, Rabbi. It's politics. Stay in your lane." No. Jews have a special responsibility at this moment.

Why? Surely Jewish teaching and tradition transcend party and ideology. Absolutely. But Jews can be safe only in democracies where the institutions that represent law and order are themselves kept safe. Anti-semitism has reared its monstrous head everywhere. Only in democratic society has it been thwarted. Do I believe the President is an anti-Semite? No. But that is immaterial. As democracy goes, so go the Jewish people. And he is hostile to the functioning of democracy.

As Jews we have a special responsibility to protect political dissent and legitimate challenges to the President from delegitimizing verbal assault and political machinations. This is not about the Presidents' policies. Of course we need democratic discourse across the entire political spectrum. That discourse can only be safe if we challenge every delegitimization of democratic institutions and practices, every time.

We should financially support politicians on the left and right challenging the President's assaults. We should give our time to organizations seeking to do the same. We should support journalism by subscribing to magazines and newspapers. But mostly, we should raise our voices in public and private. Talk to friends on the left and right. When we hear anti-democratic assaults being accepted or supported we should speak out. Don't accept the new normal.

Jews must speak up. Silence is assent. What is good for democracy is good for the Jews.

➔ FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ——— SMALL CHANGES, BIG YIELDS



Throughout Tishrei and the chagim we talked a lot about change. How we've changed in the past year, how we can change for the better in the coming year, how the world has changed around us and what that change means to us. Some changes are big and immediately noticeable, like if your neighbor chose to paint their house a bright orange. Others are more subtle and often overlooked, like if a friend parts their hair on the other side. In other words, we are more aware of change when it smacks us in the face than when it slides its way into our consciousness. Speaking of faces, think about this: at some point, faces reach a set point in our brains. We see those around us (and ourselves) frozen at a certain age or look, and we're startled when we see them next and realize our memory of them is just that: a memory. They've changed. Our perceptions have to change as well.

When big changes are made at the shul people notice, but behind the scenes there are all sorts of smaller projects going on to ensure the upkeep of the building. Did you happen to notice, for instance, that two separate stands of trees were removed from the campus prior to Rosh Hashanah? No? Most people would never even have realized there were trees there in the first place or that they were diseased and dying. But we did, and we addressed the issue. In partnership with Friends of Trees, a wonderful local non-profit helping to maintain and increase Portland's urban canopy, we will be planting young, healthy trees early next year, as close to *Tu b'Shevat* as we can. It should be a fun, interesting experience for all ages and generations.

Another project will be quite visible by this time next year: the installation of perimeter fencing along NW 25th Avenue, Kearney and Lovejoy Streets along with additional security lighting. This was a non-budgeted project that has been discussed in the past but was never achievable due to lack of funds. We are able to address this safety measure now because we were approved for a \$75,000 grant through FEMA for community preparedness. Many thanks to Matthew Subotnick for his assistance in preparing the threat assessment and investment justification.

What I'm trying to say is that there are quiet changes and improvements going on all around us. In the coming months and years we will have to turn our attentions to the major operational infrastructure in our building, which turns 55 years old in 2020. No one wants to talk about things like aging electrical, heating and cooling systems, but talk about them we must and will. They might not be the flashiest projects, but they are essential to the ongoing operation of the shul.

Shaarie Torah didn't get to a point and then freeze, never to change again. The health of the congregation—the people and the building—depend on upkeep and growth. It is our responsibility to do both.

Our Shabbat School (K-5th) is studying “Jewish Cycles” and we are learning about Jewish life cycle events, the holidays, the cycle of Torah, and other cyclical facets of Judaism. We continue to enjoy our chugim: Storytelling, Yoga, Food and Music; and our dynamic “outside-the-box” Hebrew language acquisition with Hebrew Through Movement as well as traditional Hebrew instruction.

Wednesday Night School (6th-8th+) begins every week with a truly spectacular dinner cooked by chef Serina Leedy. Our theme this year is “Jews Like Me?” and we are exploring our identities and genealogies, our story as a Jewish people, and the intersection of identity, community and individuality. We are continuing our “book group” approach bringing both traditional and contemporary voices to life through books, film, hands-on activities, speakers, community participation, and tikkun olam/mitzvah opportunities.

We have a new Tot Shabbat service on the fourth Saturday of each month at 11:30am with Rabbi Rose. Families with young children (0-5) are encouraged to check it out and stay for a delicious kiddush lunch with the whole community!

Additionally, we have some upcoming programming for teens — once a month meetings at Rabbi Rose’s house for post b’nai mitzvah students, rotating monthly Shabbat potluck dinners, and more!
