

Keva: Make Learning Central in Your Life

The Mishna in Pirkei Avot (1:15) shares a teaching from Shammai: "Make your Torah keva." What does keva mean? The word can be understood in different ways, each offering a powerful insight into how we connect with Torah and live as Jews.

Make Torah a Constant Presence

Rashi, a well-known commentator explains this teaching in two ways:

Torah isn't just for set times; it should always be part of your life. This doesn't mean you have to study Torah all day, every day. Instead, it's about making Torah central to your mindset. Your love for Torah should always be present—guiding your actions, your thoughts, and your day-to-day decisions.

Rather than treating Torah as something separate, like scheduling a tennis lesson or a coffee break, Rashi says it should be a permanent feature of your life. Even if your time is limited by other responsibilities, your commitment to Torah remains unshaken. It's the lens through which you see the world and make choices.

Rashi's second explanation reminds us that passion for Torah must translate into action. Without a plan, your good intentions may never turn into actual learning.

He advises setting a specific, realistic goal—like studying a few chapters each day. This creates a foundation for growth and ensures that Torah becomes a daily habit. These two ideas work together beautifully. On one hand, Rashi encourages us to make Torah a constant priority, woven into the fabric of our lives. On the other hand, he reminds us to ground this love in daily, achievable actions. Together, these teachings inspire us to make Torah both the heart of our lives and an everyday practice—no matter how much or how little time we have.

Tu B'Shevat

Vayikra Rabbah 25

R. Yehudah ben Pazi taught: Oh Adam, the first human, if only you could see how well things turned out! You weren't even able to follow your commandment for one hour, but your children wait to eat fruit for three years, observing the mitzvah of orlah.

ויקרא רבה כה

דָרַשׁ רַבִּי יְהוּדָה בֶּן פָּזִי, מִי יְגַלֶּה עָפָר מֵעִינֶיךּ אָדָם הָרִאשׁוֹן, שָׁלֹא יָבלְתָּ לַעֲמֹד עַל צִוּיִּךְ שָׁעָה אֶחָת, וְהֲרִי בָּנֶיךְ מַמִתִּינִין לִעָרַלַה שָׁלֹשׁ שַׁנִים.

R. Yehudah ben Pazi is pointing out a contrast between Adam, who could not wait to eat forbidden fruit for even one hour, and Benei Yisrael, who keep the mitzvah of orlah by not eating forbidden fruit for years. The midrash is pointing out progress in the world; humanity seems to be getting better. And wow, it's impressive that people are able to observe a really difficult mitzvah like orlah. That's worth celebrating!

Food for Thought:

- ~ Growth can mean a lot of things. Trees and kids get bigger, and we also become more mature and capable.
- ~What are ways you have grown since last Tu B'Shevat?
- ~How do you think you might grow before the next one?
- ~What are hard mitzvot that you feel proud that you are able to observe?
- ~Part of what is hard about the mitzvah of orlah is the need to be patient. Why is it important to nourish the middah (soul trait) of Patience (Savlanut)?
- ~When is it difficult to be patient?
- ~In what ways is it true that "good things come to those who wait?"


